# Holy Week

Holy Week began on Palm Sunday, April 14 and ended on Resurrection Sunday, April 21st. First Christian Community Baptist Church commemorated the Passion of our Lord and Savior Jesus, the Christ through a sequence of events.

**Sunday, April 14 – 11:00 A.M.** Palm Service worship service. Rev. Alphonso Tucker began Holy week by preaching a powerful sermon on Jesus' triumphant return to Jerusalem. His sermonic topic was, "Who is This?' (Matt. 21:10-11). Palms were blessed by the Pastor and distributed to the congregation.

**Wednesday, April 17** – Prayer and Praise Service was led by the Deacons. There were powerful prayers of adoration, thanksgiving and supplication by the ministers and diaconate ministry in response to written requests. Testimonies and songs of praise were offered throughout the service.

- ⇒ **Sixth Word** by Pastor James Butler, "It is Finished" (John 19:30)
- ⇒ **Seventh Word** by Pastor Alphonso Tucker from the sermonic topic, "The Word that Shows the Way" (Luke 23:46)

# Planning Committee Update

The FCCBC Planning Committee Ministry is pleased to report pre-development activities for the building renovation project continue to move forward. The architectural and civil engineering design plans have been completed for the church property and released to prospective general contractors to submit bids for the construction work. Below is a rendering of the addition to our church building:



There are four General Construction companies interested in bidding on the church construction work. They met at the Church for a mandatory pre-bid meeting on June 13th at 11:00 am. Pastor Tucker opened the meeting with prayer and introduced himself along with Trustee Robert White, Chairman of the Planning Committee Ministry to the construction company's representatives. Trustee White introduced the project architect Brian Skorpa who presided over the pre-bid meeting. Mr. Skorpa explained the bidding process and answered questions related to construction design plans. Bid sealed proposals are due July 9th and will be submitted to the business office of Skorpa Design. The sealed bids will be opened by the FCCBC Planning Committee the evening of July 9th or a designated time during that week. After a complete review of the proposals, the Planning Committee will select the general contractor to provide the services at a price that meets the needs of FCCBC.

Once the contractor is selected, Trustee Shirley Carter will coordinate the preparation of documents required to close the loan process with M&T Bank.

The Planning Committee Ministry will work with ministries to assess the impact on activities including weekly services, bible studies, and outreach. Volunteers will be solicited to assist in packing fellowship hall items for storage prior to construction.
