
Missionary Ministry Outreach

Pre-Development Activities Update

Pre-development building renovation activities reached another milestone in November 2019.

The project design plans for FCCBC church renovations received approval from the various Baltimore City's governmental departments for the 4116 Groveland Avenue construction permits. The FCCBC project is ready to move forward once the FCCBC Planning Committee Ministry completes construction contract negotiations with a General Contractor for the building renovations.

Below is the latest rendering of the exterior:



The Planning Committee Ministry continues to seek qualified General Construction contractors that will serve the best interests of Church by providing quality services at a fair price.

The Planning Committee expects that the project plans review and approval for the lot located at 4201 Groveland Avenue will be completed by Baltimore City's departments in February 2020.

As the FCCBC Planning Committee Ministry is working to complete pre-development project activities, fundraising activities will continue as FCCBC prepares for construction and operation of the renovated Church property and expansion of Church activities on the newly developed lot at 4201 Groveland Avenue.

We all know that you are most comfortable being of service with your culinary skills; do you see yourself expanding your other talents (organization) to other areas in the church?
