Outreach Center Pre-Development Activities Update

The COVID-19 pandemic has slowed down the pre-development process but FCCBC's Planning Committee Ministry continues to move forward with the FCCBC Community Outreach Center expansion at 4201 Groveland Avenue and with renovations to the church.

During the summer months, the project consultants completed the permit set design plans and submitted the documents for review to City of Baltimore permit department. The 24,000 sq. ft. lot will include a 2,200 square feet building for Church offices and a multi-purpose hall for various church and community activities. The site will also have a community garden, off-street parking, and green space for other outdoor church activities.

The expansion project also includes moderate renovations of FCCBC's current fellowship hall to increase sitting capacity and provide additional space for the Culinary Ministry's food pantry and kitchen area.

The FCCBC Planning Committee Ministry continues to work with project lender M & T Bank to complete all pre-development activities during the Fall of 2020.

FCCBC fundraising activities will continue to support the cost to the church building renovations and the development of our Community Outreach Center at 4201 Groveland Avenue.

The Planning Committee Ministry would like to thank FCCBC Members and friends of the Church for continued faithfulness and support in honoring the Building Fund pledges.

The number permitted in the church adheres to the Baltimore City Health Department's updated Gathering Guidance - as of 9/8/20 - not to exceed 50% of the maximum capacity.

There have also been some improvements within the church. There will be an upcoming FCCBC Media Ministry. We have discontinued paper bulletins and removed hymnals and bibles. At the moment, a projector has been displayed in the sanctuary presenting lyrics for the congregation to sing along, announcements, and sermonic scripture and subject (conducted by Sis. Sofie Tucker).

Here is where you must be wise, and make your decision from the start.


For right now, this is the new norm, and all of us should be smart and wise.


These are rules that everyone of us should follow and comply.
