

## **Black History Month**

For many years, our church has been graced with the recognition and celebrations of Black History Month, spearheaded by the late Sis. Carolyn Smith, the late Sis. Chrystal Nichols, Theresa Crusoe and our resident playwright Sis. Marilyn Brunt. It is unfortunate that we are still unable to celebrate in our usual manner due to the pandemic and the COVID-19 rules and regulations. However, let's take a few moments to revisit the importance of what Black History is about and why we should always reflect on it.

February is set aside as African American History Month. It is about paying tribute to the generations of African Americans who struggled with adversity to achieve full citizenship. To commemorate and celebrate the contributions to our nation made by people of African descent, American historian Carter G. Woodson established Black History Week. A Harvard-educated historian, Mr. Woodson is credited with the creation of Black History Month. It was said by a history professor at Howard University, Daryl Michael Scott that Woodson got the idea in 1915 after attending a celebration in Illinois for the 50th anniversary of the 13th Amendment, which under Abraham Lincoln's presidency, abolished slavery in 1863 in the Confederate states that seceded (go apart) from the United States. Those states were Mississippi, Florida, South Carolina, Alabama, Georgia, Louisiana, Arkansas, Texas, Virginia, North Carolina, and Tennessee. It wasn't until two years later on June 19, 1865 that all people held as property in the United States were officially free (which is why we celebrate Juneteenth).

When first established, Black History Month resulted in some controversy. Those who believed that Black History Month was limited to educational institutions questioned whether it was appropriate to confine the celebration of Black history to one month, as opposed to integration of black history into the mainstream of education the rest of the year. Another concern was that contrary to the original inspiration for Black History Month, which was a desire to redress the manner in which American schools failed to represent Black historical figures as anything other than slaves or colonial subjects. Black History Month could reduce complex historical figures to overly simplified objects of 'worshipping heroes". Some critics refer to the celebration as a form of racism. Since its inception, Black History Month has expanded beyond its initial acceptance in educational establishments. By 2020, Black History Month had become a focus way beyond schools. The Wall Street Journal describes it as "a time when the culture and contributions of African Americans take centerstage" in a variety of cultural institutions including theaters, libraries, and museums. It has also garnered attention from the U.S. business community. In February 2020, Forbes noted that "much of corporate America is commemorating" Black History Month including The Coca-Cola Company, Google, Target Corporation, Macy's, United Parcel Service, and Under Armour.

It is very clear that Black History Month has gained recognition that far surpasses basic remembering a few contributions of African Americans. It has a vast observance which extends much farther than the classrooms for one month of recognition. The observance has taken place in many different countries as well as a variety of platforms. It was best said by actor, Morgan Freeman "Black history is American History."

## Getting To Know You—Deaconess Hallie Allen

But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness and all these things shall be added unto you. (Matthew 6:33 KJV)

My earliest memory of God was when I heard my grandmother praying. I did not know who God was and why she was praying but I soon learned. When my sisters and brother and I became older, she would tell us to get on our knees and pray.

A group of parents and community leaders organized the church under the leadership of the late Rev. George Crawley in the recreation center because we did not have a church to worship in. Rev. Ernest Humphrey became the pastor. After joining the church and being baptized, I was able to sing on the Junior Choir. I was selected to be the secretary for the



Junior Ushers under leadership of Deacon Horace Johnson, who became the first superintendent of Sunday School. I was proud to be a Junior Usher because we made bags of apples, oranges, and candy for Christmas and at Easter we would dye eggs and give out candy to the children in Sunday School.

In 1954, the church had to move because the war time projects would be demolished. We finally found a church on Winchester Street and changed the name to First Christian Community Baptist Church. I had joined the Young Adult Choir which later became the Gospel Choir and we began singing at other churches One of the greatest experiences was when the choir was asked to sing at The Arena Players in the play "Tambourines of Glory." We did such a good job, we were asked to sing at other churches. It was great! Laura Jones, who worked at the Women's Correctional Center in Jessup, invited the choir to give a concert. It was hard seeing young black and white women locked up, but they were incredibly happy to see and hear us.

On Winchester Street, our church grew and became too small for the congregation. Rev. Humphrey, the Deacons, and the Board of Trustees decided to build a new church. A program committee was formed to find ways to raise money for the new church. One of the ways was giving trips. One trip was to Walt Disney in Florida. It was my first time on a plane and I enjoyed it. We continue to travel with the church to Myrtle Beach, Canada, and Pennsylvania.



In 1960, I graduated from Coppin State University and began teaching in the Baltimore City School System where I taught for 30 years. I also taught Vacation Bible School during the summer. While at the church, I met and married my husband Pearl Allen, Jr. We were married for 34 years. We had two children, Audrey and Carlton. Later, we had two grandchildren, Louis and Lauren.

Having raised enough money to make a down payment, we started building our church at 4116 Groveland Avenue. On May 11, 1975, a caravan of cars with our lights on and horns blowing left Winchester Street to go to our new church on Groveland Avenue. Our church was packed with members and friends we had a memorable day, thank the Lord. In 1979, my husband Pearl Allen, Jr. became a Deacon and I became a Deaconess. We both attended Sunday School and Bible



Study and Prayer meeting. We would go out together to visit the sick and shut-in and give communion.



I have been a member for 76 years and I have held many positions in the church. I was a choir member, Chairperson of Women's Day, Missionary, Educational, Culinary, and serve as Deaconess. I am grateful to God, my grandparents, Rev. Ernest Humphrey, and all the people who helped me down through the years. There are too many to name.

My prayer is let us resolve to build a stronger church with love, kindness, peace and faith, then the final victory will be ours and glory will be God's forever. Let us not forget the mighty spirits of our family who have departed this life to be with the Lord. Because of their contributions, our church has a history of memorable significance. Truly they tried to

make this world a better place to live in. May our Lord grant each one of us wisdom and courage to carry Coating to Trop Pour on the work they left us.

## FCCBC Planning Committee Ministry

#### **Development Activities Update**

The FCCBC Planning Committee is pleased to report that during the winter months, one phase of the FCCBC building expansion plans has been completed with the construction renovations to our main church building. The trials created by the pandemic has not prevented the FCCBC FAMILY from carrying forth the project to make improvements to the church and planning for the development of the FCCBC Outreach and Community Resource Center.

The completed construction and property improvements to 4116 Groveland Avenue include the following:

- Remodeled the lower sanctuary by removing four existing offices and two storage spaces.
- Built a large food pantry with separate maintenance supplies closet within the space. Cabinets from the fellowship hall were relocated to the food pantry space creating additional useable space.
- A new office space was built to be used as needed by church ministries.
- Because of wear and tear over the years, repairs were made to the furnace building and chimney stack. A new furnace building roof was installed and the church rear exterior walls were sealed to prevent leaks.
- The church foyer was updated by removing the old wood frame inside and from exterior front doors. A stronger PVC was installed around the front door. The foyer received a new coat of paint to make it more inviting and brighter.
- In the main Sanctuary, three monitors were installed so that announcements, hymns, and the sermon can be digitally displayed. This will help church members to remain contact free during the pandemic period.
- The generous giving of church members and friends enabled FCCBC to fund the renovations totaling \$22,000 for labor and materials.

The FCCBC Planning Committee wants to acknowledge the hard work of our chairman, Trustee Robert White, for his commitment to coordinating the main church renovations to completion. The committee continues to work on the pre-development activities related to the FCCBC Outreach and Community Resource Center. The committee has resubmitted the required bank loan application and the lender's underwriting department is currently reviewing the FCCBC's \$600,000 loan request.

The FCCBC Planning Committee leadership team met with the M & T Bank Loan Officer on Thursday March 4<sup>th</sup> at FCCBC. The meeting included a review of the project scope, budget, and timeline. The M & T Bank representative noted that the bank underwriting department is very busy with pandemic paycheck protection program applications but expects FCCBC's request to be completed by the end of March 2021.

The Planning Committee Ministry would like to thank **FCCBC Members and Friends of the Church** for their continued faithfulness and support in honoring the **Building Fund** pledges.

### Service Updates

On December 11, 2020, new COVID-19 Phase I restrictions went into effect in Baltimore City. Due to recent trends and with the virus mutating, February and March Executive Orders have expanded gatherings at religious facilities to 50% of maximum occupancy effective March 26, 2021. They were such historical moments to see both President Biden and


Vice President Harris be installed.

#### Helpful Hints

The many uses for baking soda:

- Make a paste with baking soda and water, and apply it to a burn or an insect bite for relief.
- To remove pesticides, dirt, and wax from fresh fruit and vegetables, wash them in a large bowl of cool water, add 2 to 3 tablespoons of baking soda.
- Sprinkling baking soda on your front steps will provide traction and melt the ice. Unlike rock salt, kitty litter, or sand, it will not damage outdoor or indoor surfaces or your shoes.
- A paste of baking soda (made with water & baking soda) will remove red sauce stains from plastic.
- Soak your toothbrush in baking soda and warm water overnight to clean the bristles. You can also use baking soda to brush and refresh your mouth.


Do not buy surgical masks to use as a face covering. Those are intended for healthcare workers and first responders. Many items you may already have in your home can be used to create face coverings.

#### HAMILTON CITY VILLAGE OUTREACH

Hamilton City Village continues the Homeless Outreach in the downtown Baltimore City area. Officer Lolando Hamilton and myself are so thankful for the donations from FCCBC and the community as a whole. When we started this outreach in November 2020, we had no idea how many lives we would touch. It's a blessing to bless others (Proverbs 11:25 MSG). Our last Outreach was on January 29, 2021 where we gave out thirty hot meals consisting of spaghetti and meatballs, warm dinner rolls, bottled water, and cake for dessert. Along with each meal, we offered toiletry bags, snack packs, and gently used coats, winter clothes to include socks, blankets and sanitary items for the females.

Last month, Rev. Tucker allowed us to use all of the food items from the church pantry to feed the homeless. I prepared all thirty spaghetti meals using that food and we have other meals planned for our next outreach with what we have left. I think I'll be cooking beef stew over rice!!

Anything we receive, we give out to the homeless. We accepted donations of gently used (clean) items as well as monetary donations to cover some of the things that the homeless often ask us for during our outreach. We also used monetary donations to purchase meal containers as well as the side items like dinner rolls and bottled water. All of the snack packs and toiletry items have been donated by our FCCBC family and have been a great asset to the Outreach.

Our next Homeless Outreach will be on March 6, 2021. Continue to pray for us as we go out into the Baltimore City community and do what is put on our hearts. Thank you for your support and donations. I can be reached at 443-562-5827 if you have any questions.

#### **COVID Vaccine Scheduling and Cancellation Tips and Tricks**

In trying to schedule and cancel COVID vaccine appointments for ourselves and our families, we came across a great deal of information that might be helpful to you in scheduling an appointment.

The State of Maryland is currently in Phase 1C of vaccine distribution, however, there is an extensive list of <u>essential workers</u> who can currently receive vaccines, including clergy and other essential support staff for houses of worship. Maryland is opening eligibility as follows:

Check with your health department to confirm you can get a vaccine. Beware of scam vaccine sites.

The state has launched a new pre-registration platform for the state's mass vaccination sites, Eligible Marylanders or loved ones registering on their behalf can pre-register by calling 1-855-MD-GOVAX or visit <a href="mailto:covidvax.maryland.gov">covidvax.maryland.gov</a>.

You can send a text to 898211 to receive alerts, tips, resources from MDReady related to COVID-19, Visit <a href="https://www.health.maryland.gov/coronavirus">www.health.maryland.gov/coronavirus</a> for more Maryland specific information.

#### Scheduling Vaccine Appointments:

Appointments are generally needed, however, some organizations allow walk-ins. Pre-register at as many sites as you can for which you are eligible - you can always cancel if you get your vaccine elsewhere. Don't cancel until you've confirmed with another vendor.

It may take some time to schedule an appointment. Be patient. Due to a high volume of requests and very limited supply, wait times between submitting a request form and receiving an invitation to schedule could be significant.

You can log on to <u>vaccinefinder.org/search/</u> to search for vaccines by zip code. You can choose your preferred vaccine, view locations, and available inventory.

There are usually lengthy lines at the M&T Bank Stadium and Convention Center. If you or the person you'll be taking have mobility issues, you may want to find an alternative site with easier access. Beware—the wait could be 1-2 hours. Parking is free at M&T Bank Stadium.

Vaccines are available at Mondawmin Mall for people living in zip codes 21215, 21216, 21217 who are 65 or older. Call 443-462-5864 or 443-462-5865 to make an appointment. Onsite scheduling is also available. FCCBC member Vera Hale Robinson was instrumental in advocating for vaccines at this site.

The city's hot line to help those without internet access is 410-396-2273. You can call 855-634-6829 to make an appointment at one of the mass vaccination locations.

The Baltimore County hotline number is 410-887-3816. Visit The Vaccine Hub at <a href="https://www.baltimorecountymd.gov/covid-19/vaccines">www.baltimorecountymd.gov/covid-19/vaccines</a> for information on county virus distribution statistics, vaccine specifics, getting vaccinated, and answers to Frequently Asked Questions.

The Baltimore County Department of Health and the Fire Department will work together to deploy mobile units to administer vaccines directly to Baltimore County residents who are unable to leave their homes. Residents who have been certified homebound by their physician should complete Baltimore County's vaccine registration indicating they are homebound. They will be contacted by the County to schedule a time to receive their vaccine.

#### **Retail (selected locations)**

**CVS** - If you want a particular type of vaccine, CVS identifies the type of available vaccines by location at the time of scheduling. You can sign up via their link at <a href="https://www.cvs.com/vaccinations/covid-19-vaccine">https://www.cvs.com/vaccinations/covid-19-vaccine</a>, through the CVS app, or call them at 1-800-679-9691 or 833-738-0920. If you see any availability at all on the app or online, continue to the next stage. You will be able to enter your zip code and make selections close to your home or work. CVS opens new appointments every Thursday morning.

**Giant**—visit <u>giantfoodsched.rxtouch.com</u> to search for appointments. This site only schedules first doses of COVID vaccine. Click 'Login" to modify or cancel an existing appointment

**Walgreens** should be having another walk-up clinic at the Prince Hall Lodge on Eutaw Street in early April. You can call Walgreens at (844)268-8264 to reach a person to assist you with scheduling at all Walgreens locations.

#### **Hospitals (selected locations)**

University of Maryland Rehabilitation & Orthopaedic Institute (formerly Kernan) - call 410-448-6620 to schedule an appointment. If you receive a UMMS email to schedule your appointment, but you've receive your vaccination elsewhere, click on the "Withdraw my Registration" link in the email and press submit. If you have already been vaccinated or cannot make it to your appointment, you do not need to call or email to cancel.

Lifebridge has consolidated all of their appointments into a single location—**Northwest Hospital** . You can reach sign up on the Lifebridge website under hospital registrations.

You can call Union Memorial Hospital at 410-554-4307 (Jennifer) to schedule an appointment

#### **Transportation**

Baltimore County residents who have made a vaccine appointment but are homebound and do not have access to other transportation options can call 311 to be connected to CountyRide staff. They will schedule an Uber rides for them. After receiving their vaccine, staff at the vaccine clinic will help schedule rides home.
