

The Lenten Season

"Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer." (Romans 12:12 NIV)

The Lenten season began on Ash Wednesday, February 17, 2021. During the Wednesday night Bible class, we were reminded by our pastor and teacher, Rev. Alphonso Tucker, about the true meaning of Ash Wednesday which begins a 40-day period until Easter. We were made aware that the ashes remind us of the need to repent. It is a period of reflection and renewal. The ultimate goal is to be like Jesus, to be more in tune with God.

Sunday, March 28th was Palm Sunday. We were privy to a powerful sermon by our pastor about Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, where for the first time He declared Himself as King. The topic of the sermon was "Excitement in the City." Corresponding Scriptures were Matthew 21:6-11. We received palms during the recessional that had been blessed by the pastor. Palms were also made available for drive-by pickup.

We began a 3-day corporate fast on the Wednesday preceding Easter from 6am-6pm. The pastor taught a lesson on the principles of fasting in his Wednesday night Bible class. "Fasting," he said, "glorifies God in our bodies and make us more sensitive to God and the Holy Spirit." One of the aims of fasting espoused was to prepare us for a new level of ministry in the proposed new building, which will serve and help more people in the community. Pastor Tucker also emphasized the fact that prayer is an essential part of fasting. We were encouraged to read Joel 2:5, 2 Chronicles 20:3, and Isaiah 58 for further illumination.

Each year on Good Friday, Christians take time to meditate on the depths of Jesus' sacrifice for us in suffering a humiliating, bloody, and excruciating death by crucifixion. On Good Friday at First Christian Community Baptist Church (FCCBC), the following ministers gave a vivid and moving account of Jesus' dying words from the cross, popularly known as the Seven Last Words of Jesus Christ.

Save the Date—It's Time to Build!

FCCBC members and friends, have by FAITH reached a key moment in the development process. God has removed initial project roadblocks and the coronavirus pandemic. We believe it's no accident that the pandemic is easing and FCCBC is ready to move into the construction phase.

We give our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ the praise and glory. The Planning Committee is honored to announce that all are invited to attend a ground-breaking ceremony for the FCCBC Community Outreach and Resource Center at 4201 Groveland Avenue, Baltimore MD, on Sunday, July 25, 2021. The planning for this special occasion has begun and more details will be forthcoming via the FCCBC website, Facebook page, and general church announcements over the next month.

The FCCBC Planning Committee would like to give a heartfelt thank you to church members and friends of the church for financially supporting the pre-development phase of the project that has been completed. Trustee Robert White, Planning Committee Chairman, states "continued financial support of pledges from FCCBC Church Members and Friends are needed during the construction phase of the project to achieve the total development cost of \$941,498."

Thanks also to our financial partner M & T Bank, represented by Mr. David M. Miller, Vice President Relationship Manager, for approving the project construction loan of \$600,000. The project development team includes key FCCBC leaders, KCW Engineering, Skorpa Design Studio, Sigma Development LLC, J & J Concrete, and Malill, LLC.

The FCCBC Community Outreach and Resource Center building will enable the congregation to continue expansion of theological education components like bible study, Sunday School activities and summer Vacation Bible School with the building of meeting space areas. The additional space will also provide needed office space for FCCBC administrative staff, community green space, a church garden, and off-street parking.

The Planning Committee previously reported the completion of phase one of the FCCBC church expansion with renovations at 4116 Groveland Avenue main church building. The renovations included additional space for a larger Culinary Ministry food pantry, creation of re-designed office space for other church activities, capital improvements to the church furnace building and chimney stack, and updates to the church foyer (removal of old wood frame inside and exterior front doors, and fresh coats of paint). **It's Time to Build and continue God's work.**

I'm glad she didn't go with Keats for my first name as I think I would have been teased a lot. I guess she chose Keith because it sounds like Keats. I am the middle child. I have two older brothers and two younger sisters. We grew up in Southwest Baltimore on Leeds Street. I went to Irvington Elementary, Gwynns Falls Park Junior High, and Baltimore Polytechnic Institute. I am a graduate of Morgan State University.

At the age of 12, I was baptized at Charity Community Church of God. I remained a full time member there until I entered the military. While at Morgan, I joined the Reserved Officer's Training Corps and in December 1976 I was commissioned a 2nd lieutenant in the United States Army. I spent twelve years in the military serving in many capacities. My assignments found me at Ft. Dix, NJ, Ft. Eustis VA, Ft. Leonardwood, MO, Rotterdam The Netherlands and Ft. Meade, MD.

After I left the military, I found employment with Maryland Occupational Safety and Health where I worked for thirty-one years. I retired in January 2021 as an Assistant Chief. I was the first African American to attain that position in the history of the agency.

I have so many things for which I am thankful to God. I am married to the best person I have ever known—my wife Kitty. I have two sons (Karl and Keith Owens) who have never given me a bit of trouble. Two wonderful grandchildren and a great daughter-in-law.

I am honored to serve on the Diaconate ministry at First Christian Community Baptist Church under the leadership of Deacon Lawrence Waller.

In March of 2020, I was diagnosed with cancer. I had an operation to remove part of my colon and I spent two weeks in the hospital. The most important blessing that came out of my experience is that God did not let the spirit of fear enter my body. I'm so thankful for that. I am also thankful for the support of my family especially my wife, Pastor Tucker, and my church family. I am so glad to be back to give God the praise in corporate fellowship. Juneteenth

Service Updates

Due to significant declines in new cases and hospitalizations, Governor Hogan announced that Maryland's state of Emergency will end on July 1st. Baltimore City will lift its COVID-19 state of emergency and all mandates on July 1st in accordance with the governor's recent announcement.

On Palm Sunday, our one-hour 11:00 a.m. in-person morning worship with reduced capacity was reinstated. Sermons continue to be streamed live via Facebook Live (https://www.facebook.com/FirstChristianCommunityBaptistChurch/) beginning at 11:30 a.m. Services can be viewed at your leisure via Facebook or accessed via our website (https://myfccbc.org/). On July 1, our services will be extended to 90 minutes and all Baltimore City COVID mandates lifted.







Helpful Hints

Summer is on the way and so are the mosquitoes and bugs. Male mosquitoes drink only nectar, but female mosquitoes like protein rich blood, which they used to nourish their eggs. The female mosquitoes prefer to bite ankles and wrist, because the blood vessels are closer to the skin surface.

How mosquitoes bites are treated:

- 1. Do not scratch the bite
- 2. Rub apple cider vinegar on your skin to repel the insect 3. Lemon eucalyptus oil
- 4. Rub garlic juice directly on the skin
- 5. If using a DEET repellent do not use one with more than 25% DEET
- 6. Put ice on the area to reduce swelling
- 7. If you are going to use a topical cream stay away from caladryl and calamine lotion.
- 8. A paste of baking soda and water can provide relief from bug bites.
- 9. Oatmeal can also help provide itch relief for bug bites and dry skin.

Hope these natural repellents will help you beat the bugs this season.



IRS sending letters to more than 36 million families who may qualify for monthly Child Tax Credits; payments start July 15

WASHINGTON — The Internal Revenue Service has started sending letters to more than 36 million American families who, based on tax returns filed with the agency, may be eligible to receive monthly Child Tax Credit payments starting in July.

The expanded and newly-advanceable Child Tax Credit was authorized by the American Rescue Plan Act, enacted in March. The letters are going to families who may be eligible based on information they included in either their 2019 or 2020 federal income tax return or who used the Non-Filers tool on IRS.gov last year to register for an Economic Impact Payment.

Families who are eligible for advance Child Tax Credit payments will receive a second, personalized letter listing an estimate of their monthly payment, which begins July 15.

Most families do not need to take any action to get their payment. Normally, the IRS will calculate the payment amount based on the 2020 tax return. If that return is not available, either because it has not yet been filed or it has not yet been processed, the IRS will instead determine the payment amount using the 2019 return.

Eligible families will begin receiving advance payments, either by direct deposit or check. The payment will be up to \$300 per month for each qualifying child under age 6 and up to \$250 per month for each qualifying child ages 6 to 17. The IRS will issue advance Child Tax Credit payments on July 15, Aug. 13, Sept. 15, Oct. 15, Nov. 15 and Dec. 15.

Eligible families should file tax returns soon

The IRS urges individuals and families who haven't vet filed their 2020 return – or 2019 return – to do so as soon as possible so they can receive any advance payment they're eligible for.

Filing soon will also ensure that the IRS has their most current banking information, as well as key details about qualifying children. This includes people who don't normally file a tax return, such as families experiencing homelessness, the rural poor, and other underserved groups.

For most people, the fastest and easiest way to file a return is by using the Free File system, available only on IRS.gov.

Throughout the summer, the IRS will be adding additional tools and online resources to help with the advance Child Tax Credit. One of these tools will enable families to unenroll from receiving these advance payments and instead receive the full amount of the credit when they file their 2021 return next year.

Additionally, later this year, individuals and families will also be able to go to IRS.gov and use a Child Tax Credit Update Portal to notify IRS of changes in their income, filing status, or number of qualifying children; update their direct deposit information; and make other changes to ensure they are receiving the right amount as quickly as possible.

Other tools coming soon

The IRS has created a special Advance Child Tax Credit 2021 page at IRS.gov/childtaxcredit2021, designed to provide the most up-to-date information about the credit and the advance payments.

In the next few weeks, the page will also feature other useful new online tools, including:

- An interactive Child Tax Credit eligibility tool to help families determine whether they qualify for the Advance Child Tax Credit payments.
- Another tool, the Child Tax Credit Update Portal, will initially enable anyone who has been determined to be eligible for advance payments unenroll/ to opt out of the advance payment program.

Later this year, it will allow people to check on the status of their payments, make updates to their information, and be available in Spanish. More details will be available soon about the online Child Tax Credit Update Portal.

Child Tax Credit Changes

The American Rescue Plan raised the maximum Child Tax Credit in 2021 to \$3,600 for qualifying children under the age of 6 and to \$3,000 per child for qualifying children between ages 6 and 17. Before 2021, the credit was worth up to \$2,000 per eligible child, and 17 year-olds were not considered as qualifying children for the credit.

The new maximum credit is available to taxpayers with a modified adjusted gross income (AGI) of:

- \$75,000 or less for singles,
- \$112,500 or less for heads of household, and
- \$150,000 or less for married couples filing a joint return and qualified widows and widowers.

For most people, modified AGI is the amount shown on Line 11 of their 2020 Form 1040 or 1040-SR. Above these income thresholds, the extra amount above the original \$2,000 credit — either \$1,000 or \$1,600 per child — is reduced by \$50 for every extra \$1,000 in modified AGI.

In addition, the entire credit is fully refundable for 2021. This means that eligible families can get it, even if they owe no federal income tax. Before this year, the refundable portion was limited to \$1,400 per child.

The IRS urges community groups, non-profits, associations, education organizations, and others with connections to people with children to share this critical information about the Child Tax Credit as well as other important benefits. The IRS will be providing in the near future additional materials and information that can be easily shared by social media, email and other methods.
