Project Planning Committee

The Project Planning Committee continues to meet every month to work towards getting the Community Outreach Center ready for use. Currently, there are just a few minor tasks that need to be completed before we will be ready to use the building daily.

<u>Community Outreach Center Occupancy Permit</u>

The Occupancy Permit is one of the documents required for use of the building. It was received in mid-April moving us closer to beginning building operations.

Parking Lot Rear Gate

The original contractor selected to install the rear gate was unable to complete the installation of the rear gate to our standards. The Planning Committee was able to secure a second contractor to complete the gate installation. The gate will be installed on rollers to allow easy opening and closing. It is expected that the gate installation will be completed by the end of April 2023.

Furniture Donation

The Project Planning Committee secured donated furniture for the Pastor and Administrative Assistant's offices and reception area. Additionally, we have obtained tables and chairs for the conference room and general seating areas. These donations were made from the Federal Government through their Federal Supply Property Release Program.

Building Usage

The Project Planning Committee is working on a Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) Document. This document will define the parameters for building use for both FCCBC members and external users. More information will be provided regarding the release of this document during the morning announcements.

Audio Visual Equipment

The project planning committee has contracted a local vendor to install an audio-visual system that will allow transmission of services from the church sanctuary to the Outreach Center. The contractor will also install capabilities for this system to interface with the internet to support our Facebook Live presentations. Additionally, the system will provide Wi-fi signal distribution to all corners of the Center.

Storm Water System

The water drainage from the building gutters and ground run-off are fed to the stormwater area surrounded by the rocks. The work related to this area must be certified for the Baltimore City Public Works department by KCW Civil Engineering Consultants to seek their release of the deposit held related to the work completed.

File Storage System

In an effort to continue improving FCCBC's historical recordkeeping, FCCBC is developing a secure, cloud based content management, collaboration, and file sharing tool to store and manage church-wide historical records and files.

A subcommittee has been tasked with the development and implementation of the system. We are in the early stages of this effort. Upon the initial release and use of this system, we will upload nonsensitive documents. Once we have reached a confidence level of the system, other documents will be added incrementally. There will be a training session for all organizations and committees to ensure that we adhere to the requirements of the site. Look for further announcements for this release during our morning service.

Moments in Black History/Black History Month

The first Negro History week was initiated by Dr. Carter G. Woodson in February 1926. Its origin was in 1915 when Dr. Woodson founded the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History. Negro History Week evolved into a monthly celebration in February. Dr. Woodson choose the month of February because it was the month in which Frederick Douglass and Abraham Lincoln were both born. He credited them with bringing slavery to an end in America. The Federal Government officially recognized and began observing Black History Month in 1976 in conjunction with the Bicentennial celebration.

In 1986, President Ronald Reagan issued Presidential Proclamation 5443, which proclaimed that "the foremost purpose for Black History Month, was to make sure, that all Americans, are aware of the African Americans struggles for freedom and equality. " This proclamation was a time to celebrate and commemorate the many achievements made by African Americans in the sciences, the arts, education, lawmakers, builders, authors, politics, military, medicine, inventors, and those who fought, suffered, and died for us to have a better life.

Our youth presented the following HISTORY MAKERS for "Moments in Black History":

Date	Presenter	History Maker
2/5/23	Sofie Tucker	Charles Harrison , who was the first African American Industrial Designer, speaker, and educator. Mr. Harrison invented the plastic garbage can. He also headed the production designs for the Sears Stores. Mr. Harrison designed over 750 consumer products.

In the earlier days the reading of Bible passages was done in school every morning. This was an activity that many students looked forward to performing. Madalyn Murray O'Hair, an atheist, filed several lawsuits that dealt with the First Amendment separation of church and state issues. In 1960 she was a plaintiff in a lawsuit that sought to prohibit Bible reading in the Baltimore public schools as an unconstitutional activity. She was determined that the reading of the Bible in school was no longer to be. What was going to happen down through the years was unforeseen. The very thought that someone could be so ungodly and so mean. Since 1962, the Supreme Court has repeatedly ruled that school-mandated prayers in public schools are unconstitutional. Ever since students stopped with the Bible reading on a daily basis, things were no longer the same. Starting off the morning did not allow students to call on God's name. Many of our children only learned the scriptures in school or at home. So many students did not have a religious background outside of school. Losing the opportunity to gain biblical knowledge was no longer a rule. All of God's promises to us and for us are found in His Word. Even if not in public schools, His Word will forever be heard.



Helpful Hints Trouble Afoot

If you have diabetes, you probably check your blood sugar every day, but do you check you feet?

Nerve damage to your feet is known as neuropathy. It is common with diabetics, a condition that also causes a decrease in blood flow to your feet. The combination can turn tiny injuries into big problems like severe infections or wounds. Regular foot care can go a long way in protecting your health. If a wound or infection goes unattended, it could cost you the loss of toes, a foot, or a leg.

Care for Your Feet

You can protect your feet by remembering to:

1. Always wear shoes

2. Check your shoes for pebbles before putting them on.

3. Cut your toenails straight across.

4. Wash your feet daily and dry the them well, especially between your toes.

When you shop for shoes, find shoes that are not too tight, and make sure you are able to wiggle your toes.

Inspect the bottoms, sides and tops of your feet daily. Watch for blisters, calluses, cuts, or skin tears, and redness or other discoloration. Be sure to tell your Primary Care provider if you notice any changes so you can be treated before they get any worse.

To my FCCBC family, I would like to share with you how my membership has been a growing and rewarding experience. I have grown personally and spiritually since I became a part of this Bible believing house of God.

Since I joined this branch of Zion, I have been involved in the following ministries: Music, Usher, Administrative, Culinary, and a myriad of other activities. I have grown personally and spiritually through these ministries. I started by participating just to be a part of a ministry, now I am participating because it is a calling from God on my life. I feel a sense of sharing and spreading God's blessings in my life through volunteerism in the house of God.

Let me share several of my ministry experiences with you. As a member of the Culinary ministry at FCCBC, this has been one of the most rewarding endeavors in which I have been involved. We the members of this ministry shop, prepare and serve food for different events such as funerals, anniversary celebrations, and any other events that request food service. We transport items to and from different food establishments as deemed necessary. In the beginning, the preparation of food items was one of my primary duties (cleaning chicken, fish, vegetable, peeling, and chopping, etc.) which I did not like but through the grace of God and learning the importance of food preparation, I have learned to do these duties with less frustration and more appreciation because in most cases, we are serving individuals that are in need of our service and it makes their "going through" a little easier. "To God be the Glory."

Beyond my FCCBC experience, I volunteer at the Woodlawn Senior Center four hours a week. I assist with the registration desk where I register or re-register individuals for membership. I take pleasure in this service, especially registering new members because most are looking for an outlet to fill a void. This void sometimes is due a recent death in the family, recent retirement, just tired of sitting at home, or feeling the need for social interaction. I take pleasure in explaining all the various activities available and it seems to bring joy and fulfillment to the void they are experiencing.

Moveable Feast is a nonprofit charitable organization based in Baltimore whose mission is to improve the health of Marylanders experiencing food insecurity and chronic illness by preparing and delivering medically tailored meals and providing nutrition education, thereby achieving racial, social, and health equity.

Through their Home-Delivered Meals Program, they provide clients with a weekly delivery containing:

- 12 frozen, medically tailored entrees
- A bag with approximately 10 servings of fresh fruits and/or vegetables

New telephone area code in June 2023

The Maryland Public Service Commission (PSC) announced the assignment of 227 as a new telephone area code which will eventually serve the same geographic area in Maryland currently served by the 240 and 301 area codes. Beginning June 14, 2023, customers in the 240/301 area code may be assigned a number in the new 227 area code when they request new service or an additional line.

Customers with a 240 or 301 area code will maintain their existing area codes and their phone numbers will not change. Under the implementation plan approved by the PSC, no new 227 numbers will be assigned in the area until the remaining 240/301 numbers are completely exhausted. When those remaining 240/301 numbers are exhausted, all future phone number assignments will be made in the new 227 area code.
