"What does it profit, my brethren, if someone says he has faith but does not have works?" (James 2:14 NKJV)

All of us have been assigned by God to do a particular work. All of God's children have been given a specific assignment as it relates to the Kingdom of God. Holy Week 2023

Holy Week (also known as Passion week) is the time from Palm Sunday through Easter (Resurrection Sunday). Also included within Holy Week are Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. On **Palm Sunday**, Jesus made His triumphant entry into Jerusalem where He declared His Messiahship and His kingship. Pastor Tucker preached on the topic of "Who is This?" The scriptural reference was Matthew 21:8-10. The answer was "He is Jesus, the king, the Son of the Most High." Of course, knowing this is not enough, he said. We need to give Him all of our praise because He is: our Rock, water in dry places, bridge over troubled waters, Lord mighty in battle, the Bright and Morning Star, Alpha and Omega, the Lily of the Valley. Also, He is a problem solver, a healer, and burden bearer.

In addition to the sermon, the Male chorus outdid themselves singing "Ride on King Jesus" and "Anointing Fall on Me." After praying over the palms by the pastor, they were distributed to the congregation.

On **Ash Wednesday**, a reference to Judas' action in Matthew 26:14-16, we had prayer and praise service which was led by the deacons. Many congregants praised and thanked God through their testimonies for His love, grace, goodness and mercy. The Bible tells us in 1 Thessalonians 5:18 to give thanks in everything because it is the will of God. Psalm 150 commands everything that has breath to praise the Lord.

On **Thursday**, we took the time to remember and celebrate **Maundy Thursday**; this was led by the deaconesses. Maundy Thursday refers to the commands Jesus gave His disciples at the Last Supper: to love with humility by serving one another and to remember His sacrifice. In remembering Jesus' sacrifice for our salvation, we also remember the service we owe others.

On **Good Friday**, we had the Seven Last Words of Christ by our Associate Ministers. In spite of time constraints, they were able to deliver the message in a succinct, compelling, and timely fashion (*See the chart of the Seven Last Words below*).

Holy Week (continued)

On **Holy Saturday**, we had a Churchwide Fast from 6 a.m.-6 p.m. That was one way of telling God that our priority at this time is to be alone with Him. It was a way of humbling ourselves before God and a part of the discipline of self-control. It was a way of sharing that we depend on God alone and draw all our strength and resources from Him. On this fast we went without food from 6 a.m. -6 p.m. However, we can fast from anything. If we give up something we love, e.g., sports, a concert or your favorite TV show, etc. to spend time with God, that is fasting also. It's just telling God that your priority at that moment is to be alone with Him. It is an opportunity for God to refresh our minds and address sin in our lives.

The week culminated in our resurrection message that was preached by our pastor at FCCBC and lived streamed on Facebook on Easter, **Resurrection Sunday**. The Resurrection was the greatest event in the history of man. Without the resurrection, our faith would be futile (1 Cor. 15:17)) The pastor's topic was "Joy in the Morning," (Matthew 28:5-8). It was a reminder that joy does not refer to a time of day but any time that our temporary troubles are over and we can experience joy. Good Friday was the worst day in history but joy came on the third day when Jesus conquered death and the grave; this was the best day, a joyous day!

On Monday July 17th - 21st, I attended The National Baptist Deacons Convention at *The Double Tree Hilton Hotel*, in Columbia, SC. Our theme was "I Press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 3:14). It was a very spirit-led experience for the week. filled with workshops, bible classes, church services, and fellowship. We started each day with an early morning (5 a.m.) prayer service. The daily workshops were based on the theme and each evening the service (7 p.m.) reiterated what we learned within the workshop. We held our communion service on Tuesday night.

The Sunday School ministry

"For whatever things were written before were written for our learning, that we through the patience and comfort of the Scriptures might have hope."

Romans 15:4 NKJV

Why go to Sunday School or study your Bible? In addition to the aforementioned Scripture, we have additional reasons to do so. This not only strengthens the faithful, but the church as well.

- 1. It provides a forum for learning. It encourages spiritual interaction between students and teachers, as well as providing a comprehensive way of learning as a group.
- 2. It helps fulfill the call of assembly of the saints. Sunday school sets the stage for better understanding of the morning service (Hebrews 10:24-25).
- 3. It is a form of fellowship. Assembling together with the saints is a form of fellowship that we are all *commanded* to do as believers and followers of Jesus Christ (Acts 2:42).
- 4. It is a way of preparation for the worship service. (Psalm 111:1) and
- 5. It is a way to know the needs of the body. It takes community and the knowledge of fellow church members to know and understand the needs of others within the body. As Paul wrote in 2 Timothy 2:15, "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth." (2 Timothy 2:15, KJV)



Vacation Bible School (VBS) study, coupled with fun and fellowship, is also very important. Learning is an ongoing and never-ending process. There is a lot to learn and a lot to be reinforced. There was a significant increase in the number of attendees this year for VBS as the pandemic seems to be behind us. To increase the number of registrants for VBS, we had registration forms available for members, neighbors, and passersby during our Shredding Day

that was held at FCCBC on May 27th. It was sponsored by the Alpha Kappa Alpha (AKA) sorority. Many of our members and neighbors availed themselves of this service to shred old documents. Vacation Bible School classes began on June 26th and was held for four days from 6-8 p.m. On Friday, June 29, we had an excursion to the Harriet Tubman's Museum in Cambridge, Maryland (*see Sis. Angela Ray's article about the trip on pages 11-12*). Harriet Tubman was truly one who captured the essence of our VBS theme: "*Leading Out Loud: Leading Others Through Biblical Examples*." Biblical characters who 'led out loud' exemplified characteristics of courageous leadership; these included Moses, Esther, Mary Magdalene, and Jesus. Also, our pastor and his wife are prime examples of saints who lead out loud. For the first time we used the FCCBC Community Outreach Center for VBS for three of our classes. Outdoor activities were limited due to inclement weather and time limitation. Individualized meals were communally served each night in the dining room. Great fellowship seemed to be had by all.

It is our hope that after feasting on the word, we will make practical application by speaking up, speaking out, and "letting our light shine." Cambridge, MD Bus Excursion

On Friday, June 30, 2023, our church, family, and friends took a trip to Cambridge, MD to "Tubman County" where we learned more about Araminta Ross "aka" Harriet Tubman. Araminta was born in Dorchester County, MD in 1822. "Tubman County" is a land rich in American history, depicting the life and legacy of Harriet Tubman.



Through *Harriet Tubman Tours*, we learned about the life of Harriet Tubman, "Minty" as she was so fondly called, her determination to be free, as well as helping others escape to freedom.

Our tour began in Cambridge. We traveled to the Dorchester County Courthouse which was the site of Harriet's first rescue. We rode to Long Wharf where the enslaved were transported by ship until 1808. We saw the "Take My Hand" mural, which is painted on the exterior wall of the

Tubman Museum and Educational Center. Traveling into Tubman County, we stopped at Stanley Institute, a historic African American one-room schoolhouse. Next, we visited the Harriet Tubman Underground Railroad Visitor Center in Church Creek, MD, which contained multi-media exhibits, an audio-visual program, research library, interpretive programs, a museum store, and information on related sites.

We saw Brodess Farm, Minty's childhood home and the Bucktown Store where she was hit in the head by a 2-pound weight thrown at her head. It was after this injury that Harriet began having vivid dreams and strange visions which she attributed to premonitions from God. These experiences, along with her upbringing, led her to become very spiritual. Lastly, we had lunch at a church in Cambridge's Pine Street neighborhood.





Helpful Hints

Safety Advice during Extreme Heat

- 1. Know the signs -If you are sweating heavily, clammy, nauseated, or cramming, move to a cool place, sip water, and cool your body down with a wet cloth or cold bath, per the CDC. If your temperature is 103 F or higher or your skin becomes hot and dry, call 911.
- 2. Hydrate slowly your body can absorb only a small amount of water at a time. Pre-hydrate safely by sipping water steadily over several hours.
- 3. On really hot days, you need to carry water and drink 6 oz. to 8 oz. every 20 minutes. If you exercise outside, for more than hour, drink an electrolyte solution (such as Gatorade).
- 4. Wear clothes that are light colored, thin, and loose fitting to aid in sweating.
- 5. Know your risk people with cardiovascular and respiratory illnesses are especially vulnerable to excessive heat (as are children and the elderly).
- 6. Stay in air conditioning during a multi-day heat wave.

Check on people who do not have air conditioning and who are at risk. Take them to some place that is cool (library, movies, or the mall).

News You Can Use

Post Office Caution

The U.S. Postal service warns users against putting checks in their mailboxes for pick-up or sending checks through the mail. The Postal Service reports that complaints of mail theft doubled in 2021 and banks report that check fraud more than doubled last year, up from 300,000 the year before. To protect your mail, it is recommended that you use a secure mail drop such as inside a post office or USPS blue boxes.

Apply for energy assistance now

The Office of Home Energy Programs (OHEP) provides bill assistance to income-eligible households in the State of Maryland to make their energy costs more affordable and to help with the prevention of loss and the restoration of home energy service. The Office of People's Counsel encourages anyone who is behind on their utility bills to not wait to receive a turn-off notice and apply for assistance.

Baltimore County Restaurant Closures and Health Violations

Ever wondered if the Baltimore County restaurant you're about to order from has been closed for health or other violations? Baltimore County has launched a <u>data dashboard</u> showing recent Baltimore County Department of Health food facility inspections. It displays the establishment name, date of closure(s), reason for closure(s), and reopen date(s) for establishments that have experienced closure due to a critical violation discovered during an inspection that could not be corrected immediately.

Avoid "Juice Jacking"

Charging up your electronic device at free USB port charging stations, such as those found in airports and hotel lobbies might have unfortunate consequences. You could become a victim of "juice jacking," yet another cyber-theft tactic.

Cybersecurity experts warn that bad actors can load malware onto public USB charging stations to maliciously access electronic devices while they are being charged. Malware installed through a corrupted USB port can lock a device or export personal data and passwords directly to the perpetrator. Criminals can then use that information to access online accounts or sell it to other bad actors.

Some tips: 1)Use your own AC, car chargers, and USB cables in AC power outlets. 2) Carry an external battery. 3) Consider carrying a charging-only cable, which prevents data from sending or receiving while charging, from a trusted supplier. 4) If you plug your device into a USB port and a prompt appears asking you to select "share data," "trust this computer," or "charge only," always select "charge only."




