
Celebrating Fifteenth Pastoral Anniversary

As usual, when we were having a good time and unmindful of the time, Trustee Robert White always has a not-so-subtle way of letting us know – it's time to go home!



How can we define love? There are so many different ways. Is it a strong affection, a fondness, a joy, an enlightening, or a feeling that always stays?


What perspective are you looking for to find the true meaning of love? To get that real true meaning, we must look to God up above.





Considering becoming a "FCCBC Culinary Ministry Member"?

Frequently asked questions:

*Isn't "Culinary" only for females?

"No, the FCCBC Culinary Ministry is open to both male & female".

*15 experience required?

"Experience is not required, However, culinary requires tasks to be completed. We ask that you are physically able, dependable and a team player."

*How often will I be needed?

"For every scheduled event, we ask each Culinary Member's availability and plan accordingly. The only schedule expectation is that each member is an active member; not just a member on paper."

*Do I need to know how to cook?

"No you don't need to know how to cook. There are many other tasks that have to be performed, i.e., {Packaging, setting tables, portioning food, greeting guest, washing dishes, etc.}"

*What do the Culinary Ministry do?

"The Culinary Ministry supports every ministry within the church as it relates to food involvement. We purchase, prep, cook, and serve food to the congregation and the community through different initiatives while maintaining & operating our commercial licensed kitchen".

*Will I be trained?

"Yes, this is an ongoing endeavor, i.e., proper cleaning of dishes & food surfaces, food cooking & holding temperatures, food handling & storage, etc.".

*Is it only cooking?

"No, it isn't just cooking, though the majority the tasks are based on food handling and food distribution.

*Do I have to attend meetings?

"The Culinary Ministry meets face-to-face on a quarterly basis and connect via conference call in preparation for each event.



On December 3, 1984, Detective Marcellus Ward Jr., was shot and killed while working on an undercover assignment-while assigned to the DEA Task Force for Baltimore City District Office.

On April 25, 2024, the Basic Agent Graduating Class No. 247 (training period January 2, 2024 through April 2024) Honored Badge 24/7 in memory of Detective Marcellus (Marty) Ward Jr.

Before the graduation ceremony, the forty-nine Basic Agents presented tokens of love and appreciation, to Detective Ward's Son, Marcellus Ward, III and his family for the sacrifice that was made on December 3, 1984.

It was an honor to witness the young women and men, receiving their DEA Badges (under the leadership of DEA Administrator Anne Milgram), willingly and ready to serve here at home in the United States and other countries.

2024 Memorial Service

This memorial service was held on May 15, 2024, at the DEA Headquarters in Arlington, Virginia.

Theme: Honoring Our Heroes, One Mission, One Team, One DEA – and One Family

Once again Detective Marcellus Ward Jr. was set apart for his service and his sacrifice. Remarks were made by U.S. Attorney General Merrick B. Garland, Deputy Attorney General Lisa O. Monaco, and DEA Administrator Anne Milgram.

A memorial roll call and tribute was made for each of the fallen DEA heroes. The "Wall of Honor" is a central, yet serene place of reflection that is located in the DEA Museum's lobby (the museum is open to the public).

There is an interactive kiosk that shares the stories of each of the Fallen Heroes from 1921 through 2022, which includes a picture of each Fallen DEA Agent.

Helpful Hints

When the Power Goes Out

Have a 'Safe at Home' Kit. Your kit should include a flashlight, powered lanterns, and plenty of batteries.

Aim to have plenty of bottled water (1 or 2 cases) enough for several days.

There should also be non-perishable foods, that do not require being heated, such as canned meats, puddings, cold cereal, trail mix, and granola bars.

A portable charger, that you keep charged up for emergencies, especially as a back-up for your cell phone.

A weather band radio, with a hand crank to keep abreast of the weather situation.

A portable generator if you live in a remote area.

Know when to leave your home. Staying in a very hot or very cold house can be life threatening, you will need to find a safe shelter.

Make sure you have all medications and emergency phone numbers to family and friends.
